### **ARE YOU AN AGGRESSIVE DRIVER?**

- *Do you tailgate?*
- *Take out your frustration on other drivers?*
- *Make frequent lane changes?*
- *Run red lights?*
- *Speed?*

### **HOW TO PREVENT BEING AN AGGRESSIVE DRIVER:**

- *Plan ahead, give yourself extra time.*
- *Concentrate – do not allow yourself to become distracted by talking on your cell phone, eating, drinking, trying to set your GPS while driving, or putting on make-up.*
- *Drive the posted speed limit.*
- *Identify alternative routes. Always have a “Plan B” in case your regular route is closed or is altered.*
- *Relax. Listen to the radio, or books on tape/CD.*
- *If possible, use public transportation.*
- *Just be late. If all else fails...just be late...remember “better late than never”.*

### **WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE CONFRONTED BY AN AGGRESSIVE DRIVER:**

- *Get out of the way.*
- *Do not challenge the driver by speeding up or not letting them get in front of you.*
- *Avoid eye contact and gestures.*
- *Report aggressive driving to the police.*

## **City Police Reported Incidents**

A weekly Crime Report of serious incidents is provided by the Rockville City Police Department to serve as an overview of incidents occurring within the City Limits of Rockville. Please note this summary does not reflect every reported incident that has occurred. Also, the words “arrested” and “charged” do not imply guilt.

### **A R R E S T S**

On 09/28/18, a request was submitted to the Montgomery County Police Departments Special Victim’s Investigative Division for two juveniles, ages 12 and 13, to be charged with possession of a dangerous concealed weapon (knives), following an incident that occurred in the 600 block of Great Falls Road.

On 10/01/18, a female, age 26, was arrested for two counts of malicious destruction of property following an incident that occurred in the unit block of Upper Rock Circle.

On 10/01/18, a male, age 30, was arrested for disorderly conduct and trespassing, following an incident that occurred in the 200 block of North Washington Street.

On 10/05/18, a request was submitted to the Montgomery County Police Department’s Special Victim’s Investigation Division for a male, age 17, to be charged with possession of CDS-Xanax, following an incident that occurred in the 15100 block of Frederick Road.

On 10/06/18, a male, age 41, was arrested for second degree assault and disorderly conduct, following an incident that occurred in the unit block of Courthouse Square.

### **I N C I D E N T S**

200 block of Park Road, an unknown subject gained entry into a vacant residence through an unlocked window between 9/17/18-1:53 p.m. and 9/29/18-1:53 p.m. Nothing was taken.

800 block of Rockville Pike, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed an unattended ditch witch transmitter and receiver that had been beside a work truck on 09/22/18 between 5:00 p.m. and 5:20 p.m.

9500 block of Veirs Mill Road, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a diamond ring from a jewelry box between 09/25/18-8:00 a.m. and 09/26/18-12:00 p.m.

300 block of Martins Lane, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a pair of designer sunglasses, spare change, and a credit card from an unlocked vehicle on 09/27/18 between 7:50 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.

300 block of Hungerford Drive, the complainant reported that an unknown subject entered the business on 10/01/18 between 5:24 p.m. and 5:25 p.m. The suspect removed several personal hygiene items from a shelf and placed them into a backpack. The suspect exited the store without paying for the items. ***The suspect is described as:***

**B/M, dark skin tone – Last Seen Wearing: bluish hat, sunglasses, dark pants, black T-shirt with white and reddish lettering on the front**

300 block of Hungerford Drive, the complainant reported that while conducting an inventory, it was discovered that several tools, supplies and equipment were missing from a government building between 09/24/18-10/03/18.

500 block of Hungerford Drive, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a purse containing a cell phone, vehicle key fob, U.S. currency, and credit cards from an unlocked vehicle on 10/05/18 between 1:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m.

5700 block of Vandegrift Avenue, an unknown subject gained entry through an unlocked rear window at a residence between 10/06/18-10:00 a.m. and 10/07/18-4:00 p.m. Once inside the unknown suspect removed a video game system and a passport.

Unit block of Upper Rock Circle, the complainant reported that two unknown subjects entered the business on 10/06/18 at 5:05 p.m. The suspects walked over to a display, removed six watches and placed them into a bag. The suspects then exited the store without paying for the items and were last seen getting into a silver/gray four door sedan. ***The suspects are described as:***

**#1- B/M, thin build, dreadlocks/twists, beard, medium brown skin tone – Last Seen Wearing: dark clothing, white sneakers**

**#2- W/M, large build, short curly brown hair, beard, light skin tone, tattoos on forearms, – Last Seen Wearing: jeans, black T-shirt with a zombie on the front**
